## ***Dozen injured at Olivet Nazarene University basketball game mishap***

A freak accident at Birchard Field House at Olivet Nazarene University injured a dozen persons, none critically, Saturday evening, January 31.

ONU was leading Purdue-Calumet by one point near the end of the first half, with a packed house, when the mishap occurred. Seven young men were leaning against a rail that encircles the running track on the upper level of the gym when the rail gave way and dropped with the boys

onto the crowd in the bleachers below. There was panic and a lot of confusion, but when order was restored, only 12 persons required medical care.

Of these, 10 were treated and released. Five members of one family were injured, two of which, a 79-year-old man who received a head laceration and his 51-year-old son who suffered a broken vertebra, being the ones who were hospitalized. An avid supporter of Purdue-Calumet, one

lady of the family said they would all be back for the rematch.

"We are so thankful we don't know what to do!" said Dr. Leslie Parrot, ONU president, who visited all of those transported to the two nearby emergency rooms. "We are certainly thankful that the accident wasn't more serious."

Dr. Parrott said "metal fatigue" was cited by police officials at the scene as the probable cause of the accident. The gym was built more than 50 years ago.

## Campus Notes

### Racial tensions flare on campuses

Six black Sinclair Community College and Wright State students who live together in a Dayton, Ohio, house last week reported that white teens have threatened them with bats, broken their windows and warned them to leave.

Vanderbilt ordered 23 white greek houses to make a "good faith effort" to integrate, and to sign anti-discrimination pledges. If they fail, they won't be allowed to re-register as student groups this spring.

### Federal appeals court rules prof can't 'cuss out' students

Midland (Tex.) College was correct in firing economics Prof. J.D. Martin for swearing at students—Martin claimed it was to "motivate them"—in class after being warned no to, the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals ruled last week.

### U. North Carolina trustees worry UNC has 'too many women' at Chapel Hill

In interviews with the Raleigh News and Observer, three trustees said continuing to have a student body 53 percent female could subsequently change alumni "patterns of giving" to UNC, and hurt state funding because women earn less in business, thus diminishing their "influence in the legislature."

### Whitman College's Philosophy Dept. celebrates a nonhonor

The American Philosophical Association allegedly sent a letter to the Spokane, Wash., school's alumni magazine, hailing the department's winning of an APA award.

But APA executive secretary David Hoekma says the APA neither sent the letter nor made the award.

"it's possible they're the victim of someone else, but there's nobody who stands to gain from this kind of a ruse but (their) department," Hoekma said.

### Brown U. student faces charges for using his checking account

Providence's Citizens Bank mistakenly credited \$25,000 to the account of student Philip Stratos, who assumed his parents in Greece had wired the money to him.

Stratos spent \$13,000 of the sum, which police say he has until the end of February to repay or risk facing criminal charges.

### Princeton gets its much-vandalized statue back

Princeton had stored away the statue of William Earl Dodge, founder of the Christian Student Movement in the late 1800s, to a museum in Stockbridge, Mass., because students—apparently disdainful of Dodge's strict vision of proper student behavior—have vandalized it regularly ever since the 1920s.

In 1965, Princeton loaned it to the Stockbridge Museum for 10 years, but decided not to reclaim it in 1975 because of fears students would wreck it again.

But Princeton took it back last week, intending to re-erect it in a newly renovated campus gym.

### Court asks U. Wisconsin to explain why faculty raises are late

Faculty members say the "catch-up" raises the legislature approved were due them by Jan. 1, but UW-Madison still hasn't paid them.

# Representative from Nazarene Theological Seminary on campus today

Today and Friday, February 12 and 13, Dr. Robert Crabtree, Director of Admissions of Nazarene Theological Seminary will be on campus to talk about graduate work in preparation for ministry. Dr. Crabtree will be discussing pre-seminary requirements for admission, the various degrees and course offered, tuition and expenses, as well as answer-

ing any questions students may have about seminary life.

NTS, located in Kansas City, Mo., offers four degree programs: Master of Divinity, Master of Religious Education, Master of Arts in Missiology, and Doctor of Ministry. The Master of Divinity program includes two specialized tracks: Religious Education and Missiology.

Tuition at NTS is \$54.00 per credit hour with a maximum payment of \$650.00 per semester for Nazarene students in the fall of 1987. There are fees totaling \$45.50 for registration, library, and student services. Applications for scholarships and grants are available from the Financial Aid office and are due July 1 and December 1 for the fall and spring semesters respectively.

The seminary offers assistance to those students in need of housing and employment. This is coordinated by the admissions assistant who also assists new students with acclimatization to the Kansas City area.

All students interested in further information are encouraged to meet with Dr. Crabtree while he is on campus.

Fellow Students and Faculty Members:

I am quite saddened to have cause to write this letter. I am writing merely to make you aware of just one more example of the "bureaucracy" of Trevecca, in which we must live.

This year I was very honored to have been selected to the 1986-87 "Who's Who". Since competitive iceskating has been such a major part of my life, it is only natural that I would want my picture taken for the *Darda* in the skating setting. I understood that the "Who's Who" award was given partially on who I am and also those things which make me the person and the individual that I am. Iceskating is the way in which I wanted my personality and individuality to be remembered in the *Darda*.

After the pictures were taken and submitted, I was told by the Academic Dean's Office that I could not use the picture. When I asked for a reason, their first reply was that the iceskating rink was inappropriate. I felt that this was an empty excuse and I told them I would not accept that for we have had several school-sponsored activities there. I preceded to see the president about this matter. I was then told that my picture was unacceptable because it was immodest, and inappropriate for the occasion. If the administration had been truthful and straightforward with me from the beginning, I might not have been so apt to fight for my case.

I was very upset because I did not feel that I was immodest or that my picture was in poor taste. I brought up the issue of "inconsistency" here at TNC. I brought up the case that the Cheerleader's pictures and ball-player's pictures are published in the *Darda* every year. How was I any different from them? Dr. Adams admitted that it is not "we" who own the school, but it is the constituents who do, and they are the ones we must please. The main concern on the part of the school was, "What will the conservatives think?" This would really create waves for the administration, because if they allowed my "controversial" picture to be published, they would run the risk of some districts refusing to pay their budgets. So... for the sake of the constituents, I was asked to submit a different picture. If I chose not to replace the picture, the option given to me by the administration and the *Darda* editor was to have my "Who's Who" page removed completely from the annual.

I have made my decision, and my page will not be appearing in this year's *Darda*. I will not compromise my belief and accept a way of dealing with this issue so that the constituents may once again be appeased. There are certain strong principles that I live by, and standing up for what I believe is one of them. If your beliefs are not worth fighting for, then they are not worth living or dying for either. I refuse to compromise my principles on this issue. Ironically enough, my quotation for the *Darda* would

have been: "the individual must be in constant struggle with his environment if he is to develop to his highest capacity. Hard conditions of life are indispensable to bringing out the best in human personality."—Alex Carrel

I am willing to leave my page out of the annual and to risk opposition if that is what it takes to make you, my friends, understand the principle involved here. It is time we, the students begin to be our own persons and not allow ourselves to become "clones" by those constituents whom we don't know, and probably never will know.

God is love.



**THE GLASS ONION**, a west Nashville establishment that showcases local bands, has received a lot of publicity in the papers during the last two weeks—not because it gives local bands a stage, but because it doesn't serve alcoholic beverages. So I guess what I'm saying is if hearing new local talent is your thing, then **THE GLASS ONION** could be your place. And, by the way, Christian acts play on Sunday evenings.

## TO HELL WITH THE DEVIL

This is one band that has really stirred up controversy in the worlds of both Christian and secular music. But what's a little controversy when you're in it for all the right reasons? Stryper's latest, **TO HELL WITH THE DEVIL**, is their best to date and it spares no expense with lyrics. They're there and, make no mistake, they're Christian.

# Hayden holds forum on Eastern Philosophy

"Go with the flow." This statement reflects one of the key concepts of the Dao as discussed at the Forum held last Friday night. The featured speaker was Taylor Hayden, owner of the Art of Karate Studio in Gallatin. Hayden, having no formal knowledge of Eastern religion and philosophy, became interested in it through his personal search for an alternative to Western religion, in particular, Christianity.

Hayden described the difference between Eastern and Western philosophy in general to give those who attended the forum an overall view of the subject.

"Western thought, explained Hayden, puts reality against itself while Eastern thought recognizes the polarity of the mind and body as one." Hayden further explained that the brain contains two

separate ways of thinking. The left side of the brain is the rational mind which processes information sequentially. The right side of the brain operates by intuition. It is this intuition that orientals make use of. True knowledge, for Easterners, is having a feel for man's place in existence.

"Westerners," according to Hayden, "cannot understand because they try to force their way of life into the Eastern framework." Hayden proposed that one should examine the culture in which Buddhism works.

The Dao is a concept that is very similar in description to God, but Hayden made distinctions. Whereas God created the universe by a master plan, the Dao operates by spontaneity and growth. God knows everything about creation. The Dao flows. It

is the pressure behind nature through a growth process.

Enlightenment is achieved by a direct pointing through the use of words or symbols that shatters relative views of the world until one sees that no view is absolute. Evil is anything that moves away from enlightenment, making man attached to the earth. Man suffers when he forms this attachment.

Instead, man should flow with nature and not fight it. This is the way to peace and harmony. This concept was summed up by Hayden as, "Make the best of where you are."

Hayden's visit "enlightened" those who attended the forum and left them with a challenge to not just examine the culture of others, but to search ourselves and examine our own ways of thinking which dominate our culture and our Christianity.



# Trevecca wins 20th

Trevecca defeated Bristol College at home Tuesday night to win their fourth game in six days and extend their winning streak to 12. The win came a day after Trevecca found that its team had broken into the elite NAIA Top Twenty, entering at the number 20 spot.

The lead changed hands 22 times before Trevecca finally settled into the groove of things with a 10-foot jumper by Senior guard Avery Patton with 11:50 to go in the game. Patton's basket added to his school-record career scoring total and was part of his game leading 27 points.

Junior Scott Hiser pulled down 18 rebounds and tossed in 16 points in a sparkling performance. Mac Heaberlin had 13 rebounds and 15 points. The other starters for Trevecca, Juniors Sandy McClain and Charles Brooks, also scored in double digits with 17 each.

The Trojans continued to raise their suffering free throw average by converting 16 of 21 for 76% on the night. Brooks was 29 for 31 from the line over the four game stretch to increase his season average to 73.2%.

In the other three games, Trevecca avenged their only TCAC loss by beating Christian Brothers 82-64 at Trojan Fieldhouse. CBC had beaten the Trojans in Memphis 90-84 earlier in January. The loss sent the Buccaneers struggling for a place in the play-offs.

Trevecca then went on the road and defeated Union University 97-87. The win came after the Trojans blew a seven point halftime lead, but they regained their composure in time to defeat the then second place Bulldogs.

The Trojans then had to travel out to Lebanon to face the giant-killers of Cumberland University. Cumberland had defeated nationally ranked David Lipscomb earlier in the season for the first time in the school's history. At the beginning of the game, it looked as if Trevecca had nothing to worry about, scoring the first nine points of the game and moving to a 21-12 lead with just under seven minutes played.

However, the upset-minded Cumberland scored nine in a row to tie the game at 21-21. The game teetered back and forth as Trevecca couldn't seem to recover. With less than a minute to go, though, Brooks got a key steal and converted it to give Trevecca a

one point lead. After exchanging baskets, it was Cumberland's ball with 24 seconds left. Brooks once again stole the show by blocking a 10-foot Cumberland shot and claiming the rebound with 3 seconds to go. Cumberland came up with a jump ball, but the alternate possession rule gave Trevecca the ball and allowed them to safely inbound the ball to clinch the win.

Trevecca plays its last regular season home game this Saturday, February 14, at 2:30 against Belmont College. Trevecca has a two game lead over cross-town rival David Lipscomb and needs to win two of its last three conference games to clinch the home court advantage through the District 24 play-offs.
