


1. Give each student a worksheet. Help your students cut out the four hearts. If you are using copies, give your students time to color the front and back of each heart.



You will need a plastic or paper cup, scissors, glue and some dry noodles, like spaghetti, for each child.

Instructions:

1. Trace the key word "Jesus" and cut off the strip at the bottom of the page along the solid line.
2. Fold the barn along the dotted lines.
3. Turn the page over and place a good amount of glue on it (especially along the edges). Glue the barn onto the cup (see the example).

Today we began the first of four lessons about prayer. Prayer is freely talking with God. Your preschooler learned that the people of the Old Testament prayed when they were grateful to God. (Psalm 136:1-9, 26) We spent time in class today praying and thanking God for what he has given us. Ask you child to explain the picture they drew in the box above which is something they are thankful for. Then take time during the week to pray with your child, thanking God for the things in their picture.





Instructions:

1. Cut a piece of yarn 45 cm long for each child. Cut out the picture of baby Samuel from the "Cut-out Section" of the student book.
2. Give each student a worksheet and have them write their name on it and trace the key word. Then have them color the picture of Hannah.
3. Have your students glue the picture of baby Samuel in Hannah's arms. Then help your students carefully cut out the pieces to make their kite.
4. Give your students time to assemble their kites. Be attentive to help whomever needs it. With tape, attach the yarn to the back of the shapes, starting with the biggest and ending with the smallest. (See the example.)
5. Ask your students to look at the picture of the girl praying and say, "Hannah prayed when she was sad. We can also pray when we are sad because God loves us and cares about us."




Today we studied the story of Deborah, a judge and prophetess who trusted God. When the Israelites asked God for help, he told Deborah to send Barak to fight against the army of King Jabin. (Judges 4:1-16). The Israelites won the battle. Your preschooler learned that God keeps His promises, so we can trust Him.







Instructions to make a torch:

- 1. Give each student a worksheet. Ask them to color the torch on the previous page and cut it out.**
- 2. Give each student a paper cup or cone made of paper. Tell them to curve the torch and put it inside the cup or cone. (See the example.)**



Instructions for the trumpet:


- 1. Have each student trace the key word and cut out the trumpet.**





During today's lesson, we heard the story of a Shunammite woman who trusted in God even though she was very sad because her son had died. (2 Kings 4:8-37) Talk to your child about moments when you felt sad. Let them know that many times it is difficult to trust God when we feel sad or when bad things happen. But we must remember that God always cares about us because he love us.


Instructions:

1. Provide a large paper clip and a paper fastener (brad) for each child.
2. Give each child a worksheet and help them cut out the strip at the bottom of the page. After they cut it out, have them fold the picture of Elisha along the solid line. Ask: What did Elisha do to help the boy? (He prayed, asking God for help.) What did God do? (He brought the boy back to life.)

Have the children place their paper clip in the center of the


- circle on the previous page and secure it in place with the brad.
 3. Explain the instructions of the game. Spin the paper clip and move the picture of Elisha the number of spaces that the clip lands on (1, 2, 3, or 4). Continue to move Elisha along the path until he reaches the boy and his mother. When they reach the end, re-emphasize the importance of prayer and trusting in God when we face a problem or we are afraid.
- Let the children take home their worksheets and have them show their families what they learned today in Sunday School.

2. Help them cut out the two pictures along the dotted lines. Then place the circle at the back of the picture of the church and attached them by placing a paper fastener through the center dots. Instruct your students to turn the circle to discover each of the drawings (see example below).
3. Tell them: "In Bible times people gathered to worship God. Many times they did it in houses. They were the church and they learned about God through His Word (turn the circle and show Figure 1). They also prayed together (show figure 2). We also go to a place we call a church to learn from the Bible, pray and praise God (show figure 3). What is the name of our church? (Allow children to respond and make sure everyone knows the correct name.) People who love and worship God make up the church. We are the church."
