SIGMA PHI ALPHA









The business office, service desk, emergency call system, switchboard, mailboxes, and house phones are conveniently located on the main lobby floor near two large fully automatic elevators. One entire floor will be public area with several lounges, beauty and barber shoppes, commissary, hobby, craft and physical therapy rooms, etc.

Opportunities for service of every kind—proximity to the Church for security and atmosphere, and at rents you can afford to pay. The efficiency begins at \$65.00 and the larger apartments at \$90.00. The higher the floor there will be a slight increase in the rent.


