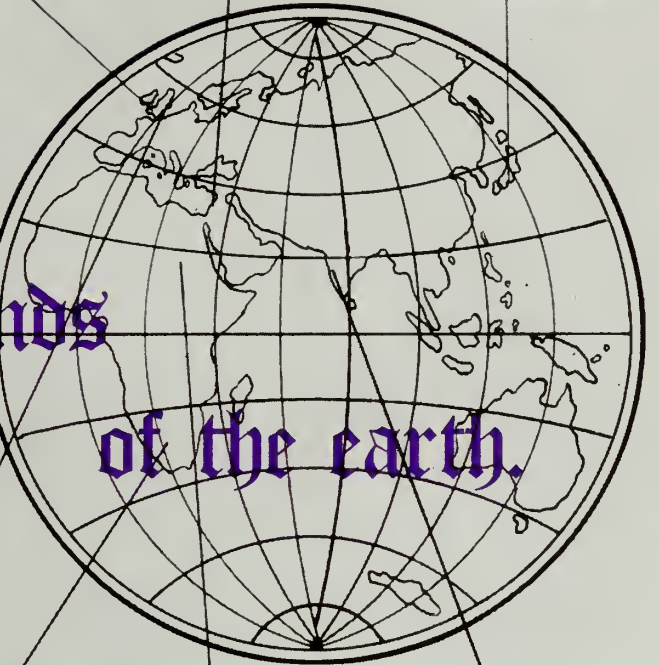
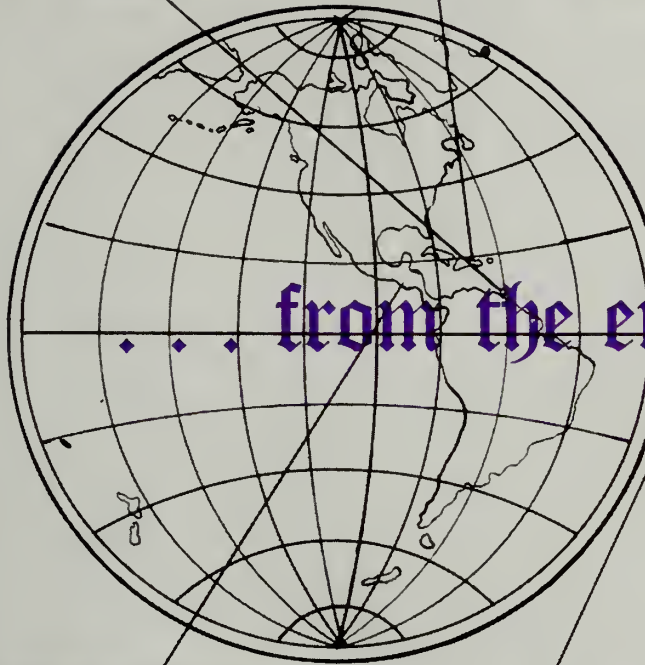


CHURCH PROGRESS
